Financial Terms Defined

Scholarships

Free money offered by nonprofit and private organizations to help students pay for college.

<u>Grant</u>

A grant is a form of financial aid that does not have to be repaid. A variety of federal grants are available.

Work-Study Jobs

The Federal Work-Study Programs allow you to earn money to pay for school by working part-time. Students earn the current federal minimum wage. Work study depends on: when you apply, your financial need, and the college's funding level.

<u>Loans</u>

Money a student/parent borrows that must be paid back with interest. If a student applies for financial aid, they may be offered loans as part of the college's financial aid offer.



Free Application for Federal Student Aid

- Just released in the last few weeks
- Giant overhaul of this year's application
- ALL students should complete the FAFSA regardless of family income
 - Fill it out as soon as possible
- The FAFSA helps colleges determine a student's financial aid package
 - Now available in both English and Spanish
 - FAFSA Application: https://fafsa.ed.gov

Scholarship Advice

- Start early
- Be aware of deadlines
- Keep track of all items needed to complete an application
- Many scholarship applications require the following items:
 - High School Transcript
 - Request from PHS Records Office: Ms. Martinez
 - (martinezb@aaps.k12.mi.us)
 - Letter of recommendation/Reference Form
 - Student Essay
- Let the student drive the process
- Once committed to a college, meet with the financial aid office

Scholarship Search Engines

Allows students to enter their specific information and then receive ongoing emails of available scholarships where they meet the criteria.


AAACF's Impact



Students can be awarded multiple scholarships

Undocumented students are eligible to apply

Awards range in size from \$1,000 to \$26,000 FAFSA completion encouraged but not mandatory

- Preferably from a historically disadvantaged background
- For college tuition and books

- One \$1000 award
- Outstanding student and athlete

WCC Scholarship Page

President's Honor Scholarship

- Applicants must have a 3.2 gpa
- Pays full tuition for two consecutive semesters (fall and winter)
- \$300 bookstore credit for each semester
- Application Deadline: March 22, 2024

Procassini Honor Scholarship

- Based on academic achievement and/or outstanding accomplishments in HS
- Pays full tuition for two consecutive semesters (fall and winter)
- \$300 bookstore credit for each semester
- Application Deadline: March 22, 2024

Excellence Scholarship

- Any high school graduate in Washtenaw County
- \$1500 for each semester
- Excellence in any area: academics, sports, community service, art, or overcoming a significant obstacle
- Application Deadline: March 22nd

- \$3500 for one school year
- Covers tuition, books, materials, and fees

- 8 student recipients
- \$1,250 in tuition each semester
- Graduating senior in Ann Arbor Public Schools
- Students not receiving other aid considered first
- Application Deadline: June 10, 2024

Morse B. Barker Memorial Scholarship

- \$2,000 split between fall and winter semesters
- Graduating senior from an Ann Arbor Public High School
- Permanent resident of Washtenaw County
- Minimum 2.0 GPA
- Deadline: March 22, 2024

Michigan Achievement Scholarship

- Up to \$5,500 per school year in scholarships from the State of Michigan
- Michigan high school graduates OR those with a GED in 2023 or after
- Resident of Michigan since July 1, 2022
- Must have FAFSA completed
- Demonstrate financial need
- Attending a Michigan community college, career training program, public university, or private university

<u>TIP</u>

Tuition Incentive Program

- Commonly referred to as TIP, provides Medicaid eligible recipients the opportunity to earn an certificate/associate degree, during a students bachelor degree program.
- Students are eligible to receive tuition assistance if they had Medicaid for at least 24 months within a 36 month period between ages 9 and high school graduation.
- Must be a Michigan resident, U.S. citizen, permanent residence with approved refugee status.
- Must be enrolled in college at least half-time.
- Must make the institution's SAP policy.
