SENIOR TIMELINE:

<u>August</u> Visit admission websites and begin college applications. Verify senior course schedule meets all grad requirements.

September Counselors begin processing college applications. Seniors continue working on college applications.

OctoberContinue working on college applications.Some music/theater programs will have Oct. deadlines.FAFSA opens up on October 1st.

<u>November</u> Early Action/Early Decision deadlines. Most college applications processed by counselors.

Senior Timeline

December/Jan.

Continue to work on applications for regular and rolling admission deadlines. Seniors notified of early decision/early action. Study for final semester exams in January.

FebruaryApplication Process winds down.Some colleges still have rolling admissions.Begin filling out scholarship applications.Request Mid-Year Transcript on Naviance.

March/April

Continue filling out scholarship applications. Continue hearing from colleges about acceptance.

Senior Timeline

<u>May</u> Deposit due for college of final choice. Seniors last day at end of month.

June Request Final Transcript in Parchment

Let Your Student Drive the Process

Student needs to be aware of college application/scholarship deadlines.



Encourage your student to communicate with counselor, other staff, and college admissions, **directly themselves**. Please avoid the temptation to log into your student's email (pretending to be them) and communicate with school staff and colleges.

Request reasonable updates from your student regarding their progress on the application process so that you can help keep them prepare to meet deadlines.

Students: Get Organized

- * Maintain a filing or folder system for each college.
- * Visit the admission website for each college for specifics.
- * Keep a checklist of application items needed for each college.
- * Create a calendar for what is due and when.
- * Set aside time on weekends to complete tasks.
- * Keep track of account usernames and passwords.

Campus Visits

We encourage students to visit college campuses to gain a real feel for that place while it is in session with students.

Some colleges even offer virtual campus visits.

College visits are an "excused" absence from PHS.

Types of College Applications

Most colleges will use the common application and some colleges will use the common application along with some of their own supplemental forms. And then, there are colleges that have their own application. Visit each college's admission website for specifics of what is needed.

FERPA SECTION OF THE COMMON APPLICATION

Applicants should consider waiving their right to look at their recommendation letters. Colleges seem to take letters more seriously that have <u>not</u> been reviewed by the applicant.

Fee Waivers

If you qualify for a fee waiver, you will indicate that in your Common App and your counselor will need to verify it on their Common App account

If you are applying to a non-Common App school and qualify for a fee waiver please see your counselor

Recommenders

- Make sure you enter your counselor's correct name and email address. Use @aaps.k12.mi.us, not @a2schools.org
- Colleges want recommendations from teachers
- Only get letters of recommendations if the college you are applying to requires them
- Give your recommenders at least 2 weeks







If you apply to a Common App member college through a different process (i.e. through a paper application or a different online application) or your counselor does not accept your invitation to submit the associated school forms online, you must place separate orders for each college.





SENDING TEST SCORES

- * SAT and AP Scores : Go to collegeboard.com
- * ACT Scores: Go to act.org

Scores must be sent to colleges directly from testing companies. Students will need to create an account to login and send scores. Students will need a credit card to pay fee for sending scores.

ACT Questions: 1-319-337-1270

Test Optional: What does that mean?



<u>Should I take the SAT or ACT if the school I'm applying to says it's</u> <u>optional?</u>

If I don't send SAT or ACT scores will it hurt my application?

If the college does not require the test, then generally NO, it will not hurt your application. But know that without test scores other parts of your application such as gpa, essay, awards, achievements, extracurriculars and recommendations, will become more important.

Many colleges, including test optional schools, will use SAT or ACT scores to award merit scholarships for incoming students. If you do well on the test, your scores could benefit your financial aid



Writing Your Essay

Select a few people to proofread/edit it.

Too many people editing your essay(s) will send you into doubt and confusion.

Answer the prompt, do your best, give details/specifics, let it go and move on.

Avoid perseverating about your essay.

Early Action and Early Decision

Early Action is <u>non-binding</u> and students receive an early response to their application but do not have to commit to the college until the normal reply date of May 1st.

Early Decision is <u>binding</u> and the student must attend that college. A student can only apply to one college for early decision. Some ED colleges will allow you to apply to other colleges through EA and some do not. Look at their admission website for specifics. Almost all ED colleges will allow you to apply to other colleges through regular or rolling admissions.

REGULAR DECISION

A college will compare every application to other before any acceptance or rejection letters are sent out. The deadline is usually around January.

ROLLING ADMISSION

A college will evaluate applications as they are received until all slots are filled for the incoming class.

Accepted/ Deferred/ Waitlisted/ Denied

Accepted **Congrats!** You've been offered admission to the college!


Deferred It's not a "No", it's a "Maybe"

College generally wants more information such as 1st semester grades.

Waitlisted

College is done reviewing your application and does not require more information. You are granted admission if a spot becomes available.

Denied You didn't get in AND it's not the end of the world.



Academics and Behavior - It Still Matters Senior Year!

- * Maintain rigor in academic schedule.
- * Avoid dropping classes. Competitive colleges expect <u>4</u> core classes.
- * Make sure your Division 1 or Division 2 athlete is registered with the NCAA. (ncaa.org)
- * A final transcript will be sent at the end of senior year to the college of choice.
- * Attendance and punctuality to classes still remains important.
- * Make good choices through the school year.
